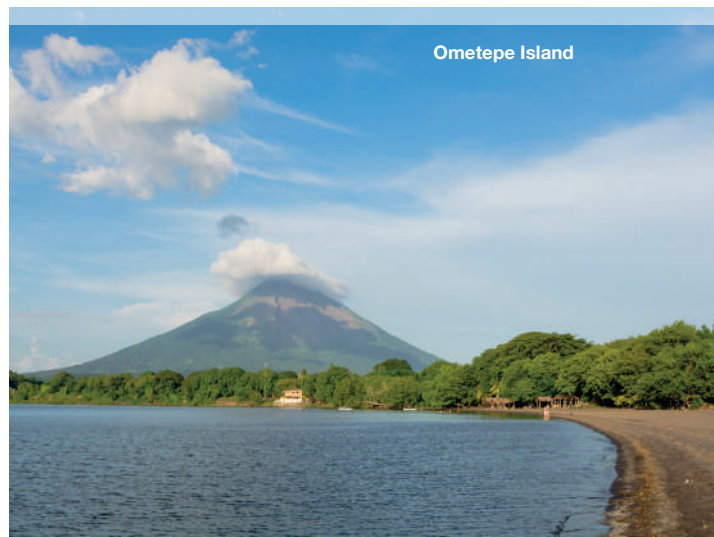
Some destinations are part of Centroamérica Verde — Green Central America— (Environmental Certifications), in them, you can enjoy ecotourism, comfort, safety, authentically natural and compromised with conservation and human development. Among them are the Mombacho Volcano Natural Reserve, Masaya Volcano National Park, and Wildlife Reserve of Los Guatusos.

The biggest island in the world with two volcanoes in the middle of a sweet water lake attracts more visitors' year after year, Definitely a fascinating natural wonder. This island, of exuberant beauty, rich in history and of kind people, is composed of two imposing conic volcanoes, the Concepción (1,610 m.a.s.l.) and Maderas (1,394 m.a.s.l.).

It has a lot to offer to those who visit, beautiful beaches, interpretive trails, archeology, museums and a lot of history, diverse species of animals and orchids.

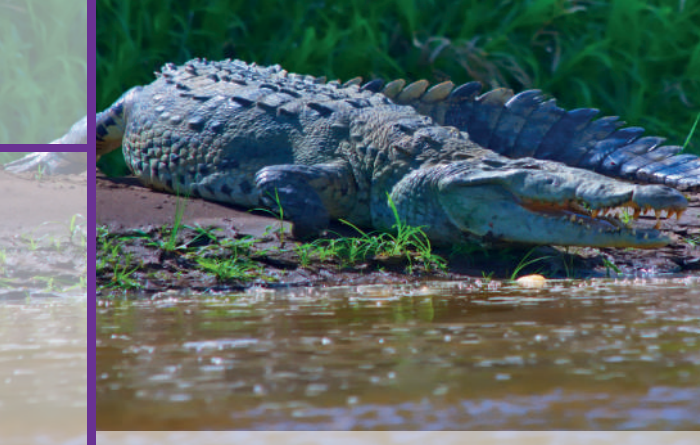
North Region

Among the touristic offer of this beautiful region of the country, you can opt for a stroll through the farms that compose it. The farms are between 800 and 1200 meters above sea level and allows visitors to learn a little more about the cultivation and grain process of coffee that has given Nicaragua so much international recognition.

Rural tourism is another activity of this region in which visitors will have the opportunity to learn of the customs and traditions of the locals.

If what you prefer is to learn about history, this place is perfect due to it was in this region where a lot of historical and political events of our country occurred, it was in the north of Nicaragua where the General of Free Men, Augusto C. Sandino, launched his heroic battle in defense of national sovereignty. Another very important aspect to mention is that this is the birth of the Prince of the Castilian Letters, Rubén Darío, his birth home in Ciudad Darío, Matagalpa, has a museum in which all aspects of the childhood and life of the poet are exposed.





Adventure

Nicaragua offers the most peaceful and relaxing terrestrial destinations and places, maritime, river flows, and lacustrine scenery that any visitor can aspire to see. But if you love strong emotions, you can also find a wide fan of opportunities whose limits are dictated by your imaginations, on a scale that goes from mild to extreme.

Among these adventures, we can mention sandboarding on an active volcano, canopy, kayak, sun and beach, surfing, turtle nesting observation, sailing, hikes, trekking, rappel, and sport fishing.

San Juan River

This destination is a paradise surrounded by Lake Cocibolca and the San Juan River. This place of exuberant wildlife is a Biosphere Reserve and has plenty of mysterious places that are still to be discovered, since it was the scene for several historic events through the years. It was a transit route, where pirates and conquerors once roamed seeking treasures.

Chronicles tell stories about how wondered they were with this paradise, passing by the Solentiname Archipelago, with its dreamy scenery, original handcrafts made of driftwood, and spectacular primitive paintings. The San Juan River Department possesses many places of interest such as San Carlos, the port of fishermen, Natural Wildlife Reserves, the Biological Reserve of Indio Maíz, and San Juan of Nicaragua.

Gastronomy

Nicaragua is characterized by its delicious gastronomy based in its majority on corn, which has been a heritage generation after generation since the precolonial period. Many visitors are delighted with dishes like the güirila (unprocessed corn tortilla) and nacatamal (meat and cornmeal tamale), drinks like the pinol or the tiste (both corn-based), and with delicious desserts like the rosquillas (corn bisquits) or cosa de horno (corn and flour pastries), definitely a delight among our ancestral and unique culinary art.

The varied gastronomy of Nicaragua goes in hand with its pluricultural since in the Nicaraguan Caribbean Coast there are delicious dishes prepared based on yuca (Cassava) and coconut, when it comes to cooking seafood, the Caribbean Coast has its special touch that mixes in with the kindness and contagious smiles of its people.

Granada and Leon

Charming colonial cities and of the oldest of the American Continent, founded in the XVI century, today they are national historic icons.

Varied architecture stands out that goes from baroque up to neoclassic, a product of a cultural combination, that reminds us of a stately time.

Credit Cards and Travelers Checks

Credit cards are accepted and used in a numerous amount of establishments and banks all over the country and travelers checks can only be exchanged in some banks. There are ATM's available in the airport, the majority of tourism destinations and malls.

Currency Exchange

The most frequent is the exchange from American Dollars to Cordoba's and vice versa. The official exchange rate can be consulted in the web page: www.bcn.gob.ni. The American Dollar is commonly accepted throughout the whole country.

Internal Transportation

There is a wide offer of rent a cars, taxis, touristic operators and buses. La Costeña provides local flight services.

Work Schedule

Shopping Malls are usually open every day till 8:00 p.m. without closing at lunchtime. The government offices are open to the public from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The bank

service times are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday and Saturdays until 12:30 noon.

You can do your shopping with all the safety and tranquility in any of the Shopping Malls located in Managua, like Metrocentro, Plaza Inter, Managua Shopping Center, Galerías Santo Domingo, Multicentro Las Américas, Multicentro Las Brisas. Shopping for souvenirs and typical crafts from the country can be purchased in any of the popular markets and crafts sale points of each city.

Restaurants
